Arrival Procedure

Select Sites customers should go straight to the campsite reception on arrival where they will be required to fill in a registration form. Reception, where English is spoken, is open from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. all season. There is an electric barrier (closed between 00.00 a.m. – 07.00 a.m.) which is operated by a card. Customers should leave the car outside the barrier and go to the main campsite reception, or if that is closed to the bar to find a member of staff. We advise that you ring ahead to warn the campsite if you expect to arrive late. Identification is to be left in reception, either a passport or Camping Carnet.

Please note you will be required to leave a small deposit (approximately €20) for the barrier pass.

Life On Site

This friendly family run site is the perfect setting for a quiet relaxing holiday, where you can experience the real Dutch culture as it is very popular with Dutch families.

Useful Information

- **Swimming pool:** The outdoor pool is heated and has a small water slide suitable for younger children. It is open from mid May to early September. There is also a large recreation lake next to the site which is suitable for swimming and has a small sandy lake beach.
- **Washblocks:** There are 2 wash blocks on site, with clearly separated sections for Ladies and Gentlemen. Please note, most campsites do not provide toilet paper in the wash blocks and some campsite sanitary blocks do not have toilet seats.
- **Barbecues:** Charcoal and Gas barbecues are all allowed on your pitch.
- **Internet access:** There is no internet access onsite, but there is WiFi cover over part of the site.
- **Gas bottles:** Gas bottles can be exchanged on site.
- **Motorhome service point:** there is a Motorhome service point on site.
- **Fridge hire:** This facility is not available onsite.
- **Electricity:** There will be a 10 amp standard 3 pin European electricity hook-up available on your pitch.
- **Dogs:** Dogs are allowed on site, but they must be kept on a lead.
- If you require any up-to-date information on taking your dog abroad, please get in touch. We'd be happy to book any necessary vets appointments on your behalf.

Campsite Activities and Entertainment

During The Day

- **Tennis** There are two floodlit courts on artificial grass onsite.
- **Cycle hire** This is available on site, it a very a good area for cycling and there are a number of cycle paths in the local area.
- **Animation** A recreation program runs during the Dutch holidays (May holiday, Ascension and Whitsun) and also from mid July to the mid August. There is also a site run children's club, for children 4 – 12 years, with crafts and games which operates in July and August.

Food and Drink

There is a cosy onsite restaurant with a bar terrace which overlooks the swimming pool and serves homemade, freshly prepared meals with a good choice of main meals and deserts. A snack-bar also offers fries, snacks, sandwiches to eat in or take-away. The site also offers a barbecue menu, offering a choice of barbecue packages. These dining facilities are open from late April to mid September.

Shopping

There is a small campsite shop which is open all season and sells freshly baked bread, croissants, sandwiches and newspapers as well as a few groceries. There is also a Jumbo supermarket about 1km from the site.

A family orientated programme of events takes place in high season including bingo evenings and a children's disco.

Around & About

Set in attractive countryside, this site is next door to a pretty recreation park with a lake for fishing and boating and is a good base to explore the Brabantse Meierij region of The Netherlands.

While you're here try...

Patat These are similar to French Fries, but thicker and served with mayonnaise, or mayonnaise and sate-sauce (patatje oorlog) or with mayonnaise, ketchup and raw onions (patat special). Patats can be bought from any snack bar or stall.

Stroopwafel A kind of cookie made with two thin waffle-type wafers and a special caramel filling. The waffle is cooked at high temperature on a waffle iron and syrup is spread on the two halves before they are put together

Dutch Cheese The Netherlands is famous for its cheese; the most well-known are Edam, Gouda and Leiden cheese. Every region in the country produces cheese, anything from mild to extra mature, seasonal to mass produced varieties. Some cheeses are flavored with cumin, chives, garlic or cloves and sheep's and goat's cheese are also produced. (The best known cheese markets are in the Towns Edam, Gouda, Woerden and Alkmaar.)



Beaches

There is a small sandy lake beach at the site.

Where to Shop

- **Sint Oedenrode** – 2km, a small town with a number of shops and there is a supermarket just 1km from the campsite.
- **Eindhoven** – 20km, a city with covered shopping centre, large department stores and an extensive selection of boutiques and specialist shops.
- **Tilburg** – 38km, the sixth largest city in the Netherlands with plenty of shops, bars and restaurants. The main shopping street is Heuvelstraat. Some shops open on a Sunday in this city.

Local market days (usually mornings only) are as follows:

Tuesday – Eindhoven, 'De Markt' a weekly market, in the city centre

Saturday – Eindhoven, Woenselse markt near the city centre for a general market and De Markt for art and crafts

Sporting Activities

- **Golf** – there is a golf course just 500m from the campsite.

Must Sees and Dos

Eindhoven – 20km.

The country's fifth largest city, with a long history dating back to 1232, a modern skyline and bustling city centre filled with shops, bars, pubs and restaurants. Here you will also find the Van Abbemuseum, a leading museum for modern and contemporary art, the 'Artificial Light in Art Centre' with a unique collection of paintings and sculptures created from light and the 'Open Air Museum' which looks back to prehistoric times and the Middle Ages.

Loonse-en Drunense duinen - 32km

The 'Shifting Sands of Loon and Drunen' is a national park which includes dunes of drift sand from the west coast. The park extends over 35 square kilometers.

Beekse Bergen Safari Park and Playland ('Speelland') – 38km

The largest wildlife park in the Low Countries, with over 1,250 animals. You can take a safari by bus, boat, car or foot. The Playland is separate from the safari park and has lots to keep children amused from trampolines to slides, swings, mini-golf, mini-cars, playgrounds and water attractions.

National War and Resistance Museum – Overloon 46km

A 35 acre park on the location of one of the fiercest tank battles of World War II. Today you will find tanks, planes, guns, antitank devices and many other items from that period of history. A large building houses a museum.

Arnhem – 71km

The Airborne Museum 'Hartenstein' and Information Centre focus on the famous Battle of Arnhem (September 1944). Weapons, document, films and photographs are on display and in the underground area Airborne Experience (covering 900 square metres), you will find yourself in the middle of the battle as history 'comes alive'. Battlefield tours can be taken in the Arnhem and Oosterbeek area as well as elsewhere.

Amsterdam - 105 km

A wonderfully picturesque city split by 165 canals, with the waterways crossed by 1,281 bridges. There are a wealth of attractions to explore, including The House of Anne Frank, The Van Gogh Museum, The Rijksmuseum (home of one of the most renowned paintings in the world – 'The Night Watch' by Rembrandt), The Diamond Quarter and The Royal Zoo.

Events

Festivals and Fairs in Tilburg 38km

There are a number of events throughout the year, including the 'May Market' with over 600 stalls and the annual 'Tilburg Fun Fair' held over 10 days every July – the biggest fun fair in the Benelux.

Windmills are an iconic part of the Dutch landscape. Every year the country celebrates National Windmill Day when windmills throughout the country open their doors to the public; in 2014 this takes place on the 10th and 11th May.

New Law re Breathalysers in France

Please be aware that a new law came in to force from 1st July 2012 that makes it COMPULSORY for all motorists in FRANCE to carry a single use breathalyser. We advise that if you are travelling to (or through) France you should carry at least two disposable breathalysers in order to comply with this new law. The breathalysers you purchase must comply to French regulations and will carry the 'French certification mark' 'NF'. These should be purchased prior to departure in the UK but can also be purchased on the ferry, in most French supermarkets, service/petrol stations or chemists. You could receive an on-the-spot fine if you cannot produce this product when asked.

Dutch Public (Bank) Holidays 2015

- Sunday 5th April - Easter Sunday (Eerste Paasdag)
- Monday 6th April - Easter Monday (Tweede Paasdag)
- Monday 27th April - Kings Day (Koningsdag)
- Monday 4th May - Remembrance Day (Dodenherdenking)
- Tuesday 5th May - Liberation Day (Bevrijdingsdag)
- Thursday 14th May - Ascension Day (Hemelvaartsdag)
- Sunday 24th May - Whit Sunday (Eerste Pinksterdag)

Some organisations and businesses close on public holidays. Although some shopping centres and grocers open for part of the day, the majority of shops do not. Police stations and hospitals do not close. When a public holiday falls on a Thursday or Tuesday, it is common practice to take off the Friday or Monday so creating a very long weekend.

Handy Hints and Tips

Shop Opening & Closing - The classic shopping days are Monday to Saturday, with shops generally open from 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Stores generally close on Sundays. In Eindhoven there is late night shopping on Fridays until 9pm.

Please Note - Although some larger stores, or those in popular tourist areas, may remain open at lunchtimes and Sundays, this is optional and not guaranteed.

Car breakdown - Please note that in the event of breakdown all customers insured through Select Sites should consult their Insurance Terms and Conditions booklet.
