Arrival Procedure

Select Sites customers should go straight to the campsite reception on arrival where they will be required to fill in a registration form. Reception, where English is spoken, is open from 9am to 12.30pm and then from 1.30pm to 6pm in low season, and from 8.30 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. from mid July to the third week in August. Customers unavoidably delayed, arriving after the barrier is down (11pm to 7am) should leave the car outside the site and go to the main campsite reception to speak to security or to the bar to find a member of staff. We advise that you ring ahead to warn the campsite if you expect to arrive late. Please note, you will be given ID cards/bracelets on arrival and you will need to leave a deposit for these, you will also need to leave a 20 Euro refundable deposit for the Barrier Pass Card.

Life On Site

This is a small, peaceful site with friendly helpful staff who can provide lots of advice to help you make the most of your stay in this pretty area.

Useful Information

- **Swimming pool:** There is a heated outdoor pool and a children's pool on site. These pools are normally open from mid May until mid September, depending on the weather. Next to the site is a large recreation area with a large lake which has a small lake beach and is suitable for swimming and rowing.
- **Washblocks:** There is one large sanitary block on site, with clearly separated sections for Ladies and Gentlemen. Please note, most campsites do not provide toilet paper in the wash blocks and some campsite sanitary blocks do not provide toilet seats.
- **Barbecues:** Charcoal, Gas and Electric barbecues are all allowed on your pitch.
- **Internet access:** This is available on site in the campsite reception and there is also WiFi cover over the majority of the site.
- **Gas bottles:** These can be exchanged on site.
- **Motorhome service point:** There is a Motorhome service point on site.
- **Fridge hire:** This is not available on this site, but it is possible to freeze ice packs.
- **Electricity:** There will be a 10 amp standard European 3 pin electricity hook-up on your pitch.
- **Dogs:** One dog is allowed on your pitch, but it must be kept on a lead.
- If you require any up-to-date information on taking your dog abroad, please get in touch. We'd be happy to book any necessary vets appointments on your behalf.

Campsite Activities and Entertainment

During The Day

- **Cycle Hire** available is on site from April to October for adults and children. Please note bike helmets are not available.
- **Animation** is organized in July and August, with regular children's discos and sports tournaments.


Please be aware that in the early and late season, the complete range of activities may not be available. Any opening times are for guidance only, as these may vary and are subject to change by the campsite owner. Please check at reception on arrival.

Food and Drink

There is an onsite bar and restaurant combined, which was refurbished in 2013 season. The restaurant offers a small choice of good food from a menu which changes daily and includes an à la carte selection. The chef's speciality is the organic Biesland steak. Alternatively you can just enjoy an evening drink at the bar. There also a snack bar/ take-away facilities which offer snacks and chips. The dining facilities are open from Tuesday to Sunday from early April to late October. If you prefer to go out to dinner in one of the many good restaurants in Delft, please ask at the site reception and they will be happy to recommend a restaurant to you.

Shopping

There is a small well stocked shop selling fresh milk, vegetables and groceries, with a bakery area selling bread which is freshly baked seven days a week. The shop is open from early April to late September.



During The Evening

Family orientated entertainment is arranged in high season with occasional bingo evenings, evening shows, talent competitions and themed nights.

Excursions

The campsite can help with trips to Delft, Alkmaar and Gouda. Walking and cycling excursions are also organised; the campsite can arrange for customers to have a discount on the guided walking tours of Delft (please book in advance at reception.)

Around & About

The campsite is centrally situated in a large nature and recreation area, yet is just a 15 minute walk away from Delft. You can take a bus (Number 80) direct into the city (this bus runs from early June until the third week in August, every half an hour from and to the campsite). If you are travelling in the evening (after 7pm) use bus number 81. Please check with the campsite reception for full details of the bus services. The cities of The Hague, Rotterdam and Amsterdam are all within easy reach.

While you're here try...

Patat These are similar to French Fries, but thicker and served with mayonnaise, or mayonnaise and sate-sauce (patatje oorlog) or with mayonnaise, ketchup and raw onions (patat special). Patats can be bought from any snackbar or stall.

Stroopwafel A kind of cookie made with two thin waffle-type wafers and a special caramel filling. The waffle is cooked at high temperature on a waffle iron and syrup is spread on the two halves before they are put together

Dutch cheese The Netherlands is famous for its cheese; the most well-known are Edam, Gouda and Leiden cheese. Every region in the country produces cheese, anything from mild to extra mature, seasonal to mass produced varieties. Some cheeses are flavored with cumin, chives, garlic or cloves and sheep's and goat's cheese are also produced. (The best known cheese markets are in the Towns Edam, Gouda, Woerden and Alkmaar.)



Beaches

There is a small lake beach at the lake in the adjacent recreation area, but the coast is just a short drive away. The popular seaside resort Scheveningen is only 15km from the site and there is a lovely beach here and also a beach reserved for naturists. At Katwijk (31kms) you will find an excellent sandy beach where you can hire sailing dinghies and canoes. There is another beach at Noordwijk Aan Zee (40kms).

Where to Shop

- **Delft** - just 1km from the site. Here you will find a post office, banks (most have cash point Machines), a chemist and supermarkets.
- **The Hague** – 12km offers all the shopping facilities you would expect from major cosmopolitan centre.
- **Leiden** - 23kms away; a large old university town with shops, banks, restaurants and bars. There are also two good supermarkets ('Aldi' and 'Dygro's').

Local market days (usually mornings only) are as follows:

Tuesday - Rijnsburg (afternoon), Katwijk (high season) and Rotterdam

Wednesday - Leiden and Amsterdam (stamp market).

Thursday – Delft, The Hague (flea market), Amsterdam (Gouda cheese and antique market) and Noordwijk (afternoon)

Friday - Alkmaar (cheese market), Amsterdam (antique market) and Katwijk (afternoon).

Saturday – Delft, Rotterdam (flea market) and Amsterdam (stamp market).

From Monday to Saturday there are general, flea, flower and rare book markets in Amsterdam.



Sporting Activities

- **Golf** – There are two courses nearby: Delfland Golf (www.delflandgolf.nl) and DSV Concordia Golf (www.concordiadelft.nl)
- **Cycling** – The Netherlands is the perfect place to explore by bike.

Delft – 1 km

The historic town centre is beautifully preserved, with many lovely buildings, streets and canals. You can take boat trips through the canals, or visit one of the many museums and galleries. The town is famous for the blue and white Delftware earthenware pottery, but it is also known for its association with the artist Johannes Vermeer. The Museum het Prinsenhof used to be a royal residence and the town has a long association with the Dutch royal family; there are several royal sites and you can also follow a 'Royal Walking Route' in the town. www.delft.nl/delften/

Delftse Hout Nature and Recreation centre – next to the campsite.

There is a lake here with small beach, ideal for swimming and rowing in the summer months. There is also a children's farm and 'water playground' and the 'De Papver' information centre.

The Hague – 12 km

A city of beautiful historical buildings, places, squares and parks. The 'Museum' offers a hands-on approach to the story of our planet and its inhabitants from the earliest times to the present day, and is a good day out for all the family.

Rotterdam Zoo – 16km

This wonderful zoo and Oceanium is visited by around 1.5 million people every year and is one of the most popular attractions in the Netherlands.

Leiden – 23 km

This beautiful city is the home of the oldest university in the Netherlands. It has 12 interesting museums all within walking distance of each other, including the National Museum of Antiquities, with sculptures, ancient vases and Egyptian and Roman finds, the Municipal Museum with a collection of valuable paintings, applied arts and local antiquities and the National Museum of Ethnology has large collections from all over the world but mainly Indonesia. The city hosts festivals all year round.

Duinrell, Theme Park – 20km

Open from 31 March to 2 November 2012, this a theme park for all ages. There is also the popular 'Tiki' pool complex with big waterslides.

Noordwijk Space Expo – 35 km

This is Europe's first permanent space exhibition where you can see what it was like for the first men on the moon and experience the simulated launch of an 'Ariane' rocket. Discover the world of satellites and find out all about astronauts. www.spaceexpo.nl

Keukenhof Gardens – 42 km

These world famous gardens showcase the best and most beautiful flowers in the Netherlands. This is one of the most photographed sites in the world, attracting more than half a million visitors each year. They are open daily from 21 March – 20 May 2013, when the gardens burst into a kaleidoscope of colours as 7 million flower bulbs bloom over 32 hectares. www.keukenhof.nl

Amsterdam – 61 km (45 minutes by train).

A wonderfully picturesque city split by 165 canals, with the waterways crossed by 1,281 bridges. There are a wealth of attractions to explore, including The House of Anne Frank, The Van Gogh Museum, The Rijksmuseum (home of one of the most renowned paintings in the world – 'The Night Watch' by Rembrandt), The Diamond Quarter and The Royal Zoo. www.iamsterdam.com/en/visiting

From the A13 motorway take the Delft exit (No:9), turn towards Pijnacker and then right at the first set of traffic lights then follow signs to the site.


Directions From 1st October 2013

From the A13 Motorway, coming from direction Rotterdam, take exit number 9. At the end of the exit turn right at the traffic lights towards Ikea. At the Roundabout in front of Ikea turn left and drive parallel to the motorway A13. At the end of this street turn right and you will find the campsite after 300m on the left side of the road.

From the A13 Motorway coming from direction Den Haag, take exit number 9, at the end of the exit at the traffic lights turn left towards Ikea. At the roundabout in front of Ikea turn left and drive parallel to the motorway A13. At the end of this street turn right and you will find the campsite after 300m on the left side of the road.

New Law re Breathalysers in France

Please be aware that a new law came in to force from 1st July 2012 that makes it COMPULSORY for all motorists in FRANCE to carry a single use breathalyser. We advise that if you are travelling to (or through) France you should carry at least two disposable breathalysers in order to comply with this new law. The breathalysers you purchase must comply to French regulations and will carry the 'French certification mark' 'NF'. These should be purchased prior to departure in the UK but can also be purchased on the ferry, in most French supermarkets, service/petrol stations or chemists. You could receive an on-the-spot fine if you cannot produce this product when asked.

Car breakdown - Please note that in the event of breakdown all customers insured through Select Sites should consult their Insurance Terms and Conditions booklet. Campsite reception will have information of local garages. Due to recent European legislation it is now a requirement when driving in Europe that all cars need to carry a reflective jacket at all times. These reflective jackets can be purchased almost everywhere in Europe for approx 8 to 15 Euros each.
