## Arrival Procedure

Select Sites customers should go straight to the campsite reception on arrival where they will be required to fill in a registration form. Reception, where English is spoken, is open from 8am to 10pm in low season and from 7.30am until 11.30pm in July and August. Customers unavoidably delayed, arriving after the barrier is down (10pm to 8am in low season and 10.30pm until 7.30am in high season) should leave the car in the car park and go to the main campsite reception to speak to security or to the bar to find a member of staff. We advise that you ring ahead to warn the campsite if you expect to arrive late and someone will wait for you.

# Life On Site

This is a small, family run site in a beautiful rural setting near to the quaint old market town of Larochette.

## Useful Information

- **Swimming pool:** the solar heated outdoor swimming pool is open from late April mid September.
- **Washblocks:** there are two wash blocks onsite, with clearly separated sections for Ladies and Gentlemen. In addition a brand new wash block should be available for high season. Please note, most campsites do not provide toilet paper in the wash blocks and some campsite sanitary blocks do not have toilet seats.
- **Barbecues:** Charcoal, Gas and Electric barbecues are all allowed on your pitch.
- **Internet access:** There is internet access in the bar there is also WiFi cover over the majority of the site.
- **Gas bottles:** Gas bottles can be exchanged on site.
- **Motorhome service point:** there is a Motorhome service point on site.
- **Fridge hire:** This is not available at the campsite, but it is possible to freeze ice packs.
- **Electricity:** There will be a 16 amp standard 3 pin European electricity connection approximately 10m from your pitch.
- **Dogs:** A maximum of 2 dogs are allowed on your pitch, but they must be kept on a lead. If you require any up-to-date information on taking your dog abroad, please get in touch. We'd be happy to book any necessary vets appointments on your behalf.

## Food and Drink

There is a cosy bar and restaurant, with a large outdoor terrace which overlooks the swimming pool. The food is highly rated by customers; the restaurant offers an à la carte menu with a range of starters, main dishes and desserts. Special dietary requirements (for example gluten free dishes) can be catered for on request. The take-away is part of the restaurant and offers chips, sausage, pizza and chicken – you will need to bring your own containers. Adjacent to the restaurant is a very good indoor children's play area. The bar, restaurant and take-away are all open from early March to early November.

## Campsite Activities and Entertainment

We have picked out a few things to do on site that may be of interest to you. For a full list of campsite activities, please refer to our brochure or website.

### During the day

This is a lovely quiet site with no organised entertainment. There is a spacious outdoor play area with slides, swings, a roundabout, a climbing frame, a sandpit and a see-saw. This play area is at the top of a large grassy field which is hedged – ideal for football and other ball games. In addition there is very large indoor play area which is well equipped with climbing frames, slide and ball pool.

### During the evening

There is no organised evening entertainment.

# Around & About

The town of Larochette is located in the valley of the White Ernz and is dominated by the ruins of a medieval castle, which is set on a rock overlooking the town. It is in the centre of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and is on the border of an area known as 'Little Switzerland', a lovely region popular with hikers and nature lovers, with charming villages and historic attractions. It is possible to buy a Luxembourg Card which gives you discounted access to over 80 attractions and places of interest in the country as well as access to trains and buses ([www.ont-lu/card-en.html](http://www.ont-lu/card-en.html)).

## While you're here try...

### Judd mat Gaardebounen

This consists of smoked collar of pork (which has been soaked overnight with spices) and broad beans. Served in copious slices with the beans and boiled potatoes it is considered to be the national dish of Luxembourg.

### Gromperekichelcher

A carefully spiced potato pancake, with chopped onions and parsley, which is then deep fried.

### Quetschentaart

A plum tart – this is a typical dessert and can be found in any pastry shop, other variations used peaches, cherries or pears.

## Where to Shop

- Larochette - about 2km from the site, it has a good range of shopping facilities, including a supermarket ('Del Haize') three banks with ATMs, a chemist, a 'tabac', a post office and a small grocer's ('Caves de Portugal'), English newspapers are available at the 'papeterie' in high season.
- Mersch - 11km, with a 'Match' supermarket and a 'Cactus' hypermarket. The 'S-Bank' has a cash point that accepts Cirrus and Visa cards.
- Luxembourg - 30 km, has extensive shopping facilities. Porcelain and ceramic items are particularly good value here. Opening times for shops are 8.00 a.m. to 12 noon and 2.00 p.m. to 6.00 p.m. from Tuesday to Saturday. Most shops will be closed on Monday morning.
- Trier (in Germany) – 45km, there are four main shopping streets in the town center: Simeonstrasse, Brotstrasse, Fleischstrasse and Nagelstrasse – with large chain stores, department stores, small shops and restaurants. Around the town you will find supermarkets and every type of shop for your daily shopping needs.

**Local market days** (usually mornings only) are as follows:

Tuesday - Diekirch

Wednesday - Luxembourg city (Place Guillaume II and Place de Paris) and also on the second Wednesday of the month in Echternach.

Friday – Ettelbruck (10km)

Saturday - Luxembourg city (Place Guillaume II and Place de Paris) and also in Ettelbruck (on every other Saturday)

A Flea Market (Marché-au-Puces/Brocante) takes place on every 2nd and 4th Saturday from 9am to 2pm on the Place d'Armes in the city centre in Luxembourg, selling antiques, second hand items and collectables.



## Sporting Activities

- Fishing** - a wide variety of lake and river fishing is available in the region. Permits and information can be obtained from the District Commissioner's office (Commissariat de District) in Diekirch (14km). Fishing is also possible on the river Sûre between Ettelbruck and Wallendorf, and on Echternach lake (22km).
- Sailing and windsurfing** - customers can launch their own windsurfs on Echternach lake and sailing dinghies and motor boats on the Moselle river. Pedaloers can be hired at Echternach lake. Motorboats are prohibited on the lake at Echternach.
- Canoeing** - River canoeing may not be possible in dry weather as river levels drop. Customers can use their own canoes on the lake at Echternach and on the river Sûre.
- Walking** - there are over 30 kms of footpaths in the forests around Larochette, and many lovely walks around the fortifications and old town of Luxembourg. A 'barefoot walking track' starts right from the campsite and there are five woodland walks - to choose from which all start and end at the campsite varying from oneand a half hours to four hours in length (the site reception can provide details of the routes.) - Golf** - there is an 18 hole course at the 'Golf Junglanster' (7km). A handicap is required.
- Mountain biking** – this is a popular area for cycling and mountain-biking, for the latter the Larochette Parcours passes right next to the campsite. The nearest cycle-hire facilities are 7km from the site.

### Beaufort Castle – Echternach 22km

This is a 12th century feudal castle by a pretty lake, which is reached by driving through the lovely Mullerthal Valley.

### Vianden Château – 27km

One of the largest and most beautiful, feudal residences of the Romanesque and Gothic periods, in Europe. It was built between the 11th and 14th centuries and was restored in 1977 by the family of the Grand Duke of Luxembourg.

### Luxembourg City - 30 km

The capital of the Grand Duchy of Luxembourg has a striking location, high on a promontory overlooking deep valleys and sheer-sided gorges. It boasts a large array of historical and cultural sights, with the oldest quarters of the city classified as a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The 'Musée Pescatore' exhibits Flemish and Dutch paintings from the seventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth centuries and the National Museum tells the history of the capital and the country (free entry, closed on Mondays). A tourist train offers a ride past the major sights of Luxembourg City, departing from the Adolphe Bridge (daily from April to October), with commentaries in English. The 'Wenzel Walk' takes you along the cobbled streets of the oldest quarter of the city.

### Butterfly Garden and Wine Tour- Grevenmacher. 32 km

Butterflies from all around the world can be viewed in a hothouse, complete with tropical plants. In the same town you can visit the 'Caves Bernard Massard', where a guided tour of the wine-making process and wine tasting are available; a joint ticket for the butterfly house and the caves is available.

### Trier – 45km

As well as its excellent shops, this is reputedly the oldest city in Germany. There are many important Roman remains to visit, including baths, an amphitheatre and the 'Porta Nigra', the old Roman entrance to the city. There are also several museums here, including a toy museum and historical houses and palaces to visit.

Open from April to mid October, this animal park is home to animals and birds from Africa, America, Australia, Asia and Europe. There are also play grounds and attractions especially for young children (2-12).



# Getting To Your Site

**Location:** 2km north of the town of Larochette.

## Directions:

From Larochette town centre:  
Head southwest on Place Bleiche, after 30metres turn left to stay on Place Bleiche. After 45m take the 1st left onto Rue de Medernach / N14. After 66m take the 1st left onto Rue de Mersch / CR118/CR119. As you leave the town you will see Larochette Castle high above you. The road rises through a wooded valley. On the very sharp bend (1km from the town centre) there is a small road on the right (the Rue de l'Ecole/ CR119) which is sign posted Camping Auf Kengert. Take this road and the site will be on your right 2km further along.

## New Law re Breathalysers in France

Please be aware that a new law came in to force from 1st July 2012 that makes it **COMPULSORY** for all motorists in **FRANCE** to carry a single use breathalyser. We advise that if you are travelling to (or through) France you should carry at least two disposable breathalysers in order to comply with this new law. The breathalysers you purchase must comply to French regulations and will carry the 'French certification mark' 'NF'. These should be purchased prior to departure in the UK but can also be purchased on the ferry, in most French supermarkets, service/petrol stations or chemists. You could receive an on-the-spot fine if you cannot produce this product when asked.

**Shop Opening & Closing** - The classic shopping days are Monday to Saturday, with shops generally open from 9 a.m. to Middy, and 2 p.m. to 7 p.m. Stores generally close on Sundays.

**Please Note** - Although some larger stores or those in popular tourist areas may remain open at lunchtimes and Sundays, this is optional and not guaranteed.

**Dialing Codes** - If dialing the UK use 00 44 and drop the first 0 from the dialing code. If dialing The Republic of Ireland use 00 353 and drop the first 0 from the dialing code.

**Car breakdown** - Please note that in the event of breakdown all customers insured through Select Sites should consult their Insurance Terms and Conditions booklet. Campsite reception will have information of local garages.

Due to recent European legislation it is now a requirement when driving in Europe that all cars need to carry a reflective jacket at all times. These reflective jackets can be purchased almost everywhere in Europe for approx 8 to 15 Euros each.
